## DON'T LABEL ME: HOW TO DO DIVERSITY WITHOUT INFLAMING THE CULTURE WARS

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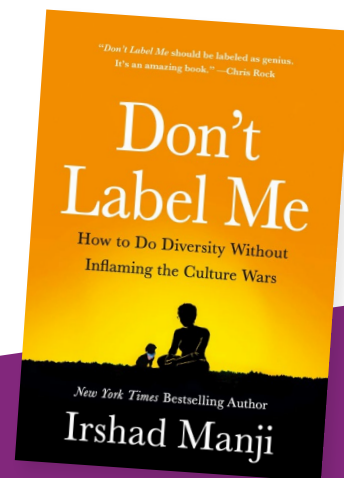
